The Stewardship Campaign for this year has been completed. As everyone knows, we started and finished our campaign a bit earlier than we normally do, in order to be able to have a compensation package ready for the Search Committee to use when we resume our rector search in January 2018.

First, I want to thank you, our parishioners, for helping make this campaign a success. You have replied with enthusiasm, filling out and turning in your pledge cards. You replied with faith, pledging to give towards our future. Thank you for your faith and your charitable hearts.

I am happy to report that our stewardship campaign was very successful. We received a total of 51 pledge cards, either filled out on paper or done online. These 51 pledges include two new pledges, with more than half of you increasing your pledge, helping us to reach our goal.

If you have not turned in your pledge card, and you would like to, it is not too late! Pledge cards will continue to be accepted through the end of the year.

The vestry is now taking these pledges and creating our budget for next year, including creating a rector compensation package for our search committee. You will hear more details at our annual meeting in January.

TOTS can surely be described as a parish family effort.

Initial plans for the 2018 *Jazz and Jambalaya* are already underway. This makes me happy because I hope that y'all do this for many years to come. Events like this build community, creating bonds that last a lifetime.
