The Best Way to Pray: Adult Sunday School During Lent

Music Captures the Season

Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. The Gloria is not sung during Lent and is sometimes replaced with the prayer: *Kyrie, eleison*. This prayer derives from the Psalms and several New Testament passages. In Matthew 20:30, 31, two unnamed blind men call out to Jesus, "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David." The phrase "Lord, have mercy" became the basis for the liturgical prayer.

During Lent we will sing the Kyrie, Sanctus and Fraction Anthem from the New Plainsong Mass composed by David Hurd. These are found in our Hymnal 1982. Hurd (b. 1950) is an African-American composer, organist, choral director and educator. He is widely recognized as one of the foremost sacred music composers, and church musicians in the United States. He was one of the major musical contributors for the Episcopal Church's **Hymnal 1982**.
