# Dear Holy Spirit Family,

Last week there were four new opportunities to deepen our connection to Christ and to one another. I am grateful for the tremendous response to these programs. On Saturday, a group of men gathered to cook, pray, eat, and share stories in the Men's Prayer Breakfast. Although I am unqualified to participate in this gathering, I hear the guys had a great time and new friendships were made. All men are invited to join them the second Saturday of every month. Monday night we began the Wisdom's Way Class, exploring the Wisdom Literature in the Bible and how it intersects with our lives today. There are many references to Wisdom in the Bible. One of those is Proverbs 3:18 where Wisdom is described in this way: "She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called happy." Come and mine this treasure trove of scripture with us. All are welcome! Although this is a series, please feel free to join us even If you can only make some of the classes. Tuesday evening the Women's Circle began the Living Compass Faith and Wellness Series. The premise of this program is a Christian approach delving into how the Spirit is calling us to greater wellness and wholeness right now. Although this group will not be open to new members until January, if you are interested in the Women's Circle, please let me or my co-facilitator Mary Hodgetts know. (If there is a need to form new circles I am open to that, in order to facilitate sharing and confidentiality there are limited slots. I also would welcome restarting the Holy Spirit ECW if there are women who are excited about making that happen.) On Wednesday, the Feast of the Holy Cross, a group of us ranging in age from 4 months to octogenarians worshiped together in the **Healing Eucharist**. Afterward, we gathered for lunch. The worship was restorative and the lunch was fun. We will offer this worship and bring your own lunch the second Wednesday of every month at 11 am.

Reflecting upon this past week, I am struck by how many different people in our community participated in these varied programs. It is exciting to see a range of ways to learn, pray, serve, and play together. Oftentimes smaller gatherings beyond our Sunday worship offer the best opportunity to get to know one another. If you have any questions about these programs or others you'd like to see us offer, please let me know.

On another note, the **Gifts of the Spirit** campaign has been quite successful with a number of parishioners completing their survey—many of whom are new to Holy Spirit. Thank you! You are welcome to join into any ministry throughout the year. Fear not if you didn't fill out your form, you can at any time. Ministry leaders will be contacting respondents in the next few weeks. Thank you all for making Holy Spirit such a loving and vibrant part of the Body of Christ.
